Sexual Assault

Air Force Victim Advocates provide essential support, liaison services, and care to a sexual assault victim.

Victim Advocates are active duty and civilian employee volunteers selected by the SARC who have completed a 40-hour training course.

Victim Advocates must possess the maturity and experience to assist in very sensitive situations.

Responsibilities include:

- Providing crisis intervention, referral and on-going non-clinical support
- Providing information on available options and resources to assist the victim in making informed decisions about the case
- Services will continue until the victim states support is no longer needed
- Does NOT provide counseling or other professional services to a victim
- May accompany the victim, at the victim's request, during investigative interviews and medical examinations

Traumatic Stress Response

It is Air Force policy to provide TSR services to enhance resilience to potentially traumatic events. TSR services will be made available in response to all air or ground mishaps that involve loss of life or major injury. TSR services may also be provided in response to other events at the request of the unit commander. At any time following a traumatic event service members may receive up to four sessions in the Mental health Clinic that are not documented and carry no diagnosis.
